Four new universities configured their Shibboleth identity providers for the DMPTool in May, bringing the total to 52 institutions.

Recent Enhancements, News, and Activities

We added support for the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) data management requirements. The DMPTool now supports 18 separate funder requirements, including 13 different NSF directorates or divisions.

34 new users from UC campuses set up accounts in the DMPTool in May. There is a total of 426 UC users, and they created 35 data management plans in May. The greatest activity among UC campuses was at UC San Diego. Overall, there were a total of 283 new users in May, which was our busiest month since January. All users created 232 data management plans.

James Madison University customized the DMPTool by adding local resources. There are now 12 institutions (outside of original partners) that have added resources.

The DMPTool Steering committee, with members at CDL, UCLA, UCSD, University of Virginia, University of Illinois, Smithsonian and DataONE, continues to work on ideas for governance, sustainability and new functionality. We are now planning a meeting in Charlottesville VA in July to discuss governance and sustainability.
